Main Duties		
<p>This post will give a broad and thorough grounding in all aspects of Dermatology. This is an outpatient based specialty and you will spend your working day in clinic. In addition you will be able to review patients referred for Dermatology input on all the other wards and bring back for case discussion with your seniors. The post is ideal for a doctor considering this as a career but also hugely useful for a future in any medical specialty including Acute Medicine and for general practice.</p> <p>The Dermatology department offers an outpatient service to the population of Northamptonshire and collaborates with the other medical teams in managing inpatient referrals requiring Dermatology expertise. We offer a wide variety of sub specialty clinics including:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Skin Cancer – These are 2 week wait rapid access one stop clinics with treating most patients the same day. You will be able to have substantial exposure for lesion recognition and training for use of Dermatoscopes. Inflammatory Dermatoses and General dermatology Clinic – Patient seen with chronic inflammatory conditions such as eczema, psoriasis, acne, Blistering Disorders, Autoimmune cutaneous Dermatitis and others. Skin surgery clinics – Excisions, Incisions, punch, shave, curettage and more complex skin cancer surgery. You would get experience in local anaesthetic infiltration and minor suturing. Contact Dermatitis Clinic – Patch Testing for allergic contact dermatitis Vulval clinics Complex case clinic- A joint clinic with all doctors in the department seeing and managing difficult cases. Biologics and other systemic therapy clinics Other Treatments carried out such as Phototherapy and Photodynamic therapy. Leg ulcer clinics. <p>With close Consultant supervision and adequate training you will be able to contribute to all these sessions. Dermatology also runs a number of interface clinics with Gynaecology and Rheumatology.</p> <p>This post will allow the trainee to complete the majority of the Foundation Core procedures (DOPS) and the required work place based assessments can also be achieved. More challenging practical procedures such as excision biopsy can be attempted with supervision. The post demands good multidisciplinary team working which will easily be developed during the attachment.</p> <p>There will be an opportunity to teach or supervise 4th year medical students undertaking the Special Senses Block from Leicester Medical school during the rotations.</p>

Educational Activities:

All FY2 will have a trained and experienced Educational Supervisor that stays with them for the whole of their FY2 year and a Clinical Supervisor for each of their 4/12 attachments. In Dermatology the Clinical Supervisor will be a Dermatologist ensuring the FY2 gets the most benefit from educational and career development opportunities.

Both clinics and referrals provide opportunity for in-depth case discussions.

The mandatory F2 teaching occurs weekly on Tuesday mornings and is protected time off the ward and bleep free. The FY2 teaching programme covers a wide range of the curriculum over the three rotations.

There will be teaching sessions delivered by Clinical Fellows, Registrars and consultants on wide range of dermatology subjects. The complex clinic once a month also provides an excellent educational opportunity. There is a regional educational meeting on 2nd Tuesday PM every month.

All junior doctors will have the opportunity to complete supervised Quality Improvement projects of their own choosing. They will be supported in this by their Educational and Clinical Supervisors and the well equipped QiP department.

The medical education department comprises of medical education, simulation resuscitation and quality improvement academia. All junior doctors with a passion for education and/or quality improvement can work with the medical education team as faculty and support the delivery of education programmes for medical students and quality and safety programmes. All our faculty can attend an in house Train the Trainer course free of charge and are also offered a peer to peer review on their teaching sessions from one of the expert medical education senior management team.

Our STEP - Student Tutoring & Education Programme – is available for all medical students on placement at NGH. STEP is a programme aimed at providing additional formalised learning opportunities for medical students in order to enhance the educational experience already gained during their placements.

As part of STEP, teaching sessions are held once weekly in small groups (2-3 students).

We encourage all FY doctors to become tutors on STEP and lead sessions.

Other Comments (if appropriate):

Our group is made up of Northampton General Hospital (NGH) NHS Trust and Kettering General Hospital (KGH) NHS Foundation Trust and was formed in 2020.

We deliver acute services from two main sites: Northampton General Hospital and Kettering General Hospital. We also provide care at several satellite locations including in Corby, Wellingborough, Irthlingborough, Danetre and GP facilities.

Both our hospitals are acute hospitals providing 24-hour emergency care.

We offer a full range of district general hospital care as well as some specialist services: NGH provides specialist cancer, vascular and stroke care for the county and KGH provides emergency cardiac care for the county. In total we have around 1,390 beds with 600 at KGH and 790 at NGH. We serve a population of approximately 900,000 people across the county and employ over 9,000 staff, making us one of the largest employers in Northamptonshire.

All our divisions are committed to doing things better with more efficiency as we update, modernise and advance. We have strong partnerships with University of Leicester and University of Northampton and are supported by the East Midlands Clinical Research Network.
